BCCC have been busy and attended a number of great meetings here and there as reported on later, with some great run outs for members and social meet ups.

Happily our Weather account must still be in credit as we just seem to land with lovely days when ever we sally forth in our beloved carriages!

Setting asise the renowned and highly desirable BCCC events and meets, this summer has seen some pretty major sporting events take place....

The Euros football kick about went on for a few weeks back in June and July ending with a Spanish victory. For those that frequent pub quizes, some useful info - This event, repeated every 4 years, first came about in 1958, after first being proposed way back in 1927 by the French Football Federations Secretary General - Henry Delauney - hence the name of the tropy that is awarded to the winning team. Prior to this event kicking off there was the British Home Championships – of 4 teams and the central European International cup of 6 teams, The first tournament was held in 1960 in France and subsequent years saw the expansion from 8 to 16 and then 24 teams all competing for the coveted trophy, which they then keep for 4 years.

The actual trophy was remodeled in 2008 to make it larger due to it being overshadowed by other UEFA trophies (and some award winning MG trophies!!), and now weighs in at 8Kg silver, and stands at 600mm tall - 2 feets in old money!

Scores on the doors for winning teams to date:

Spain 3 times, Germany 3 times, Italy and France 2 times each, and Soviet Onion, Czechoslovakia, Netherlands Denmark, Geece and Portugual 1 x each.





The next big event from early July saw the 137th edition of the strawberry laden Wimbledon tournament held as always at the All England Lawn Tennis and crouquet Club in sunny Wimbledon, with the 130th edition of the Ladies singles event!

The £50m prize money now up for grabs being dished out as follows:

Players who make it to the first round of Wimbledon's main singles draw take home £60,000. That rises to £93,000 for the second round, £143,000 for the third round, and £226,000 for the fourth round. Quarter-finalists make £375,000, and semi-finalists make £715,000. And the big prize for the singles winners is £2,700,000, not bad for a few weeks batting your dogs favourite ball about \mathfrak{S} .

He had obviously underestimated the important requirement of needing a whole heap of wing flapping to stay airborne, fortunately the bird made his way down and landed on the roof of a car in the Hospital car park, where it was successfully recovered by the Ealing Wildlife Trust and returned to the nest for a few more days practice, resulting in a successful flight!

Since then, very occasionally I have seen a parent bird visit the nest, shuffle a stone or two, and that is it till next year hopefully they return again!

The cricket club house is open for teas/cakes and lots of tables and chairs are placed outside for comfort.
