The first of our run outs way back in Spring was on the <u>National Drive it day at end of April</u>. Here we arranged to drive to the Prae Wood Arms near St Albans.

The venue was excellent and very accommodating with coffee/ tea and biccies made available to us on arrival! A full lunch menu also being available in a lovely late Georgian style, restored building,

The main event and highlight of our calendar year being the annual show at the Spires in High Barnet. This was the 9th annual event and by far the best we have organised so far. With over 110 vehicles on display the show was amazing. There were hundreds of visitors during the day, and all I spoke to (many!) commented on how enjoyable and good the show was.

The show as usual started from the Barnet Odeon (Everyman for all the youths!) with a parade running up Barnet Hill and along the High St, lined with spectators, and then round into the Spires Car Park, where we once again had sole use of the top deck. Excellent for when the sun has got its hat on as it did that day. We had a huge range of vehicles on display with some very rare and valuable cars adding to the variety, The chosen theme this year was "Lotus in Barnet" as a tribute to the great engineering genius Colin Chapman, who lived locally for a number of years and for the display we rounded up around 10 classic Lotus cars.



A big thank you is also appropriate here for Brittania Parking who manage the Spires Car Park, and willingly and generously let us have the space at no cost or our show. There is limted Space in High Barnet for a show of this size so this availablity is gratefully accepted by BCCC.







Next up was the **Enfield Pageant of Motoring** held over the Spring Bank Holiday at the end of May. The weather on the Saturday was excellent, as we have become accustomed to, and once again, we had a good club turnout and display area, with some 25 vehicles on display on the Sunday despite the slightly showery day – traditional for Enfield Pageant! There was an arena display/pageant with running commentary about the cars and the Club from our very own MC Chris Martin.





Following on in late June, the next club gathering was at The East Barnet Festival Cars in the Park.

This excellent local event was back on this year, having had to cancel in 2023 due to lack of volunteer support and sponsorship/funding.

To help the organisers out we offered our assistance with some of the car park Marshalling.

As usual there was an impressive quantity of stalls and attractions in the park with the traditional fun fair, and main music stage providing great music throughout the day and into the evening.

Some cars not seen before turned up and at the close of the day one of our BCCC members winning car of the show with a beautiful, restored and updated Jaguar.















In July, for our next outing ,an excellent run was arranged to include a stop over at the famous $\underline{\textbf{Jordans}}$ $\underline{\textbf{Mill}}$, and then onwards to $\underline{\textbf{The Shuttleworth collection}}$.

Another dry and lovely day was on offer for this great day out! A turn out of some 30+ cars included some new attendees from nearby Watford CC, and a handful of Rileys, with all being parked together just opposite the hangers and with the flying field in full view.





Shuttleworth offers not only the Hangers full of amazing aircraft- all airworthy, aviation equipment, period cars and displays of bikes etc, but also the lovely Swiss Garden and some very welcome catering facilities.

It was not an organsied flying day, however there were a handful of vintage aircraft flying through the afternoon to add to the enjoyment for the club.









Up next was the next club attendance at **Tewin Show** in August:

This event is one of the highlights of the local summer car shows . The event takes place on the cricket field in Tewin Village which is just outside of Welyn Garden City .

Having been held for a number of years now the event has grown and just gets better and better, with an amazing display of superb quality cars, there is so much to see and enjoy. Also on the field a fine collection of stalls selling local goods / produce, food, autojumble and many other must have items!

The cricket club house is open all afternoon for teas/cakes with ample tables and chairs placed outside for comfort. A live band (thanks goodness!) set up under a Gazebo near the club house playing an enjoyable range of music throughout the afternoon.

With some 400 cars attending this is an essential summer event and not to be missed.

We once again attended at this LBB organised event held on Barnet High St, for the duration, the High St is closed to traffic to allow the many stallholders and traders and displays /performers to set up . For our small display the usual site on the High St outside St john's church was reserved.

We set up our Gazebo in true festive manner with lights, balloons and a small PA belting out some Xmas classics! Unfortunately, St Johns Church Bells out did us with the decibel count at regular intervals!

The main focus of our attendance on the day being to promote our very successful "Dream Ride Raffle" fund raising in support our chosen Charity – Noah's Arks Children's Hospice.

The day started off with miserable wet weather, but at least not freezing cold. The cars were put in place and the gazebo erected, - we had an additional "wing" added for the field catering facility on the day! — Tea, coffee and bacon butties kindly organised by Kevin Watt, owner of the fab VW T2 camper van. 7 cars were on display ranging from a tiny Austin 7 Nippy, the only existing New Era Mini prototype, to the magnificent 1923 Bentley Tourer, a classic and immaculate Mini Mayfair and Triumph Stag, and the lovely VW camper Van.
